ASU Study Abroad Facts:

- Arizona State University has the largest on-campus student population in the U.S.
- The ASU Study Abroad Office offers programs in over 55 countries, totaling more than 250 different programs.
- Currently, over 1,800 ASU students study abroad each year.
- The ASU Study Abroad Office offers four types of programs: Exchange, Faculty Directed, Global Intensive Experiences and Partnership programs. Information on the differences between these programs (academic info, cost structure, etc.) is available [here](#).
- Students earn ASU credit and grades for the coursework they complete on all programs offered by the ASU Study Abroad Office. They do not earn transfer credit, are not permitted to take courses pass/fail, and cannot audit courses.
- Students are required to complete a full time course load for semester length programs (12 ASU credits or more per semester).
- ASU students may apply financial aid and scholarships to the cost of ASU Study Abroad Office programs. The ASU Study Abroad Office also offers scholarships, which we call travel grants. Other funding opportunities and information is available [here](#).
