Study Abroad Workshops

OPTION #1: Outreach Presentation (designed for students)

ASU Study Abroad Office (SAO) staff can present about study abroad opportunities by attending meetings, events, or the classroom. This presentation is designed to grow awareness about study abroad and inspire students to consider studying abroad. Our staff can tailor the presentation to suit the needs and interests of a specific student population and can take as little as 10 minutes or as much as one hour depending on the needs of the group. This presentation can be presented by SAO professional staff or Peer Advisors (previous study abroad students who are current student staff in the SAO).

Details: This workshop can be requested for a specific group of students or staff/faculty. 10-60 minutes

OPTION #2: Study Abroad 101 Workshop (designed for students)

This workshop helps students understand the basics of studying abroad through ASU including an overview of program options, housing, eligibility, academic credit, financing options, and how to apply. This workshop can be presented by SAO professional staff or Peer Advisors (previous study abroad students who are current student staff in the SAO).

Details: Presented once/month on your campus. This workshop can also be requested at additional times for a specific group of students or staff/faculty. 45 minutes

OPTION #3: Financing Your Study Abroad Program Workshop (designed for students)

The content of this workshop covers finding scholarship opportunities specifically for study abroad, applying ASU financial aid to study abroad, utilizing community-based funding, program fees and deadline details, and how to overcome 'funding myths'.

Details: Presented once/month on your campus. This workshop can also be requested at additional times for a specific group of students or staff/faculty. 45 minutes

OPTION #4: Introduction to Study Abroad for the ASU Academic Advising Community Workshop (designed for ASU staff and faculty)

This workshop is for ASU staff and faculty interested in learning more about study abroad and the services the SAO provides to all students, staff, and faculty. The workshop describes the different study abroad program types and locations, financial implications of study abroad, course registration and credits, and helpful resources for both students and advisors.

OPTION #5: How to Propose a New Study Abroad Program Workshop (designed for ASU staff and faculty)

In this workshop staff and faculty learn how to propose a new partnership, exchange, or summer faculty directed program. Attendees will receive information on the elements of a strong proposal and hear about the support services provided to all staff/faculty by the SAO.
